Over the past two years we have baptized dozens of St. Anthony students. This is a testimony to the Holy Spirit at work in our school community. My prayer is that we can continue to work with you, the primary educators of our children, to determine if this should be a sacramental year for you or your child.

Faith, academic excellence, and service are the pillars that make up a St. Anthony education. Teaching the faith is the most important part of our mission. Students pray daily, receive religious instruction, celebrate the liturgy every Friday, and participate in retreats. As a Catholic School our task also includes inviting students and their families to truly celebrate the sacraments of the Catholic Church.

According to the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*, the sacraments are effective signs of grace, instituted by Christ and entrusted to the Church, by which divine life is dispensed to us. Sacraments point to and are channels of God’s grace. They work as an effective means of communication between God and His people. There are seven sacraments, three of which are Sacraments of Initiation-Baptism, Holy Communion, and Confirmation.

I encourage you to think about where you and your family are on your faith journey. Are you baptized? Would you or children like to be baptized in the Catholic Church? Is your child baptized Catholic but did not receive First Holy Communion? Regardless of how you came to be connected to St. Anthony and the Catholic Church, I invite you to learn more about the Catholic faith.
